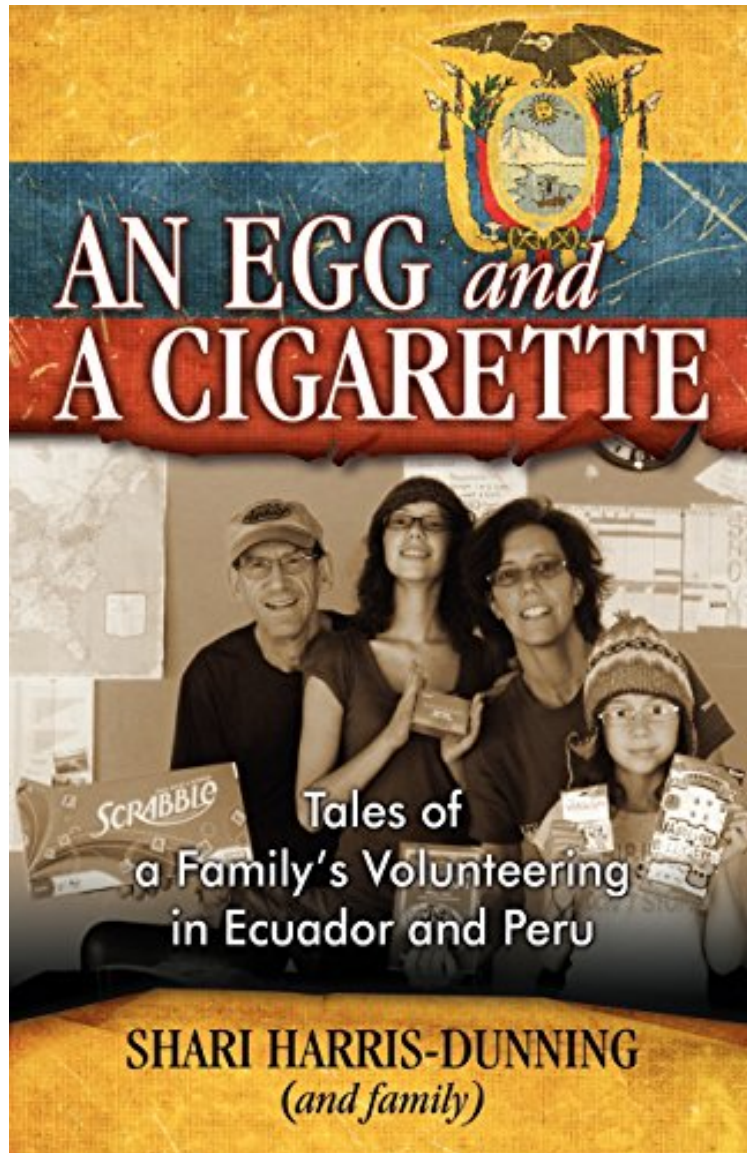


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An Egg and A Cigarette: Tales of a Family's Volunteering in Ecuador and Peru
