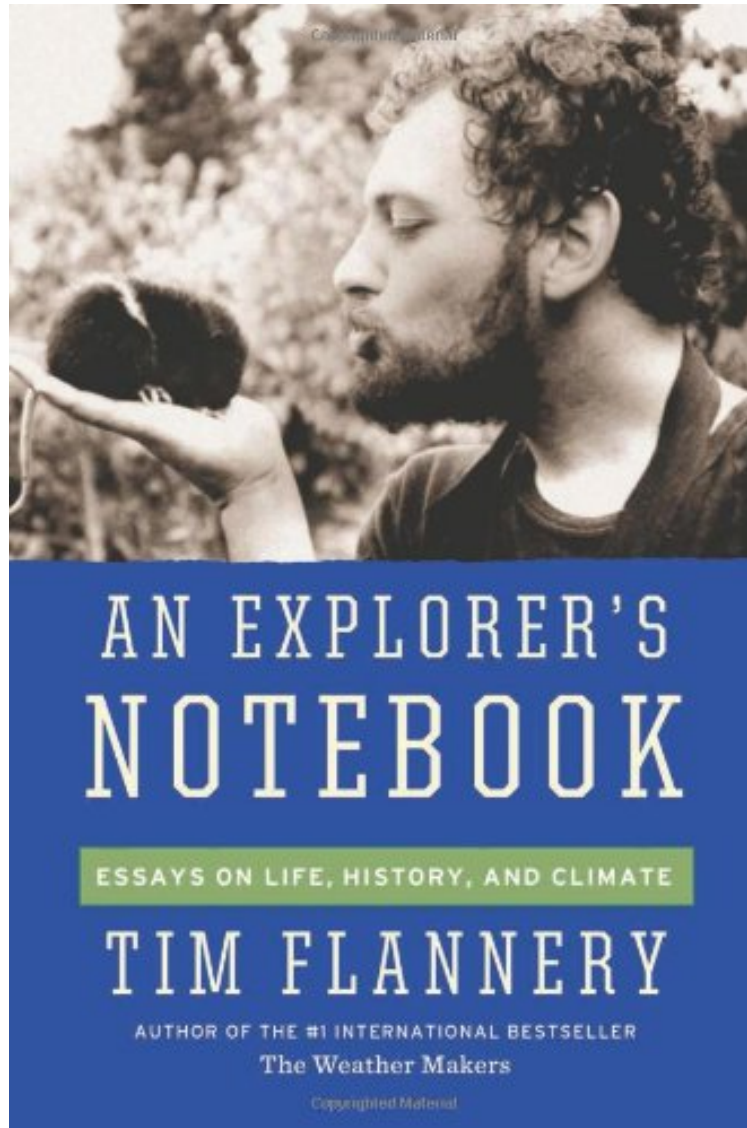

subjects. I wouldn't want people to be turned off of reading this type of science book because this one seems a little overly technical!
