With a foreword by Sir Edmund Hillary, this packed two-volume set contains 15,000 alphabetically-arranged and cross-referenced entries covering geographical features, explorers, scientists and their stations, vessels, tour operators, terms, birds, animals, insects, and flora. A 1,300-entry chronolog

From Library JournalStewart offers this encyclopedia as the first comprehensive reference on Antarctica for both specialists and general readers. He admits a "bias toward the geographical and historical," and a "reportorial" approach to scientific topics. The most detailed entries concern Antarctic explorers and expeditions. Innumerable other entries describe geological features such as glaciers, mountains, and waterways. These entries include coordinates and discoverers. Many scientific entries are cursory and would have benefited from citations to entries in the extensive bilbiography. Other features include a chronology of important dates and a list of expeditions. The encyclopedia cries out for a few detailed maps, but the author feels that this would have added to the price of the set. In sum, this work is comprehensive, handsomely produced, and a valuable addition to collections in larger academic and departmental libraries, but smaller libraries might do better to select a few of the available books on Antarctic exploration and
