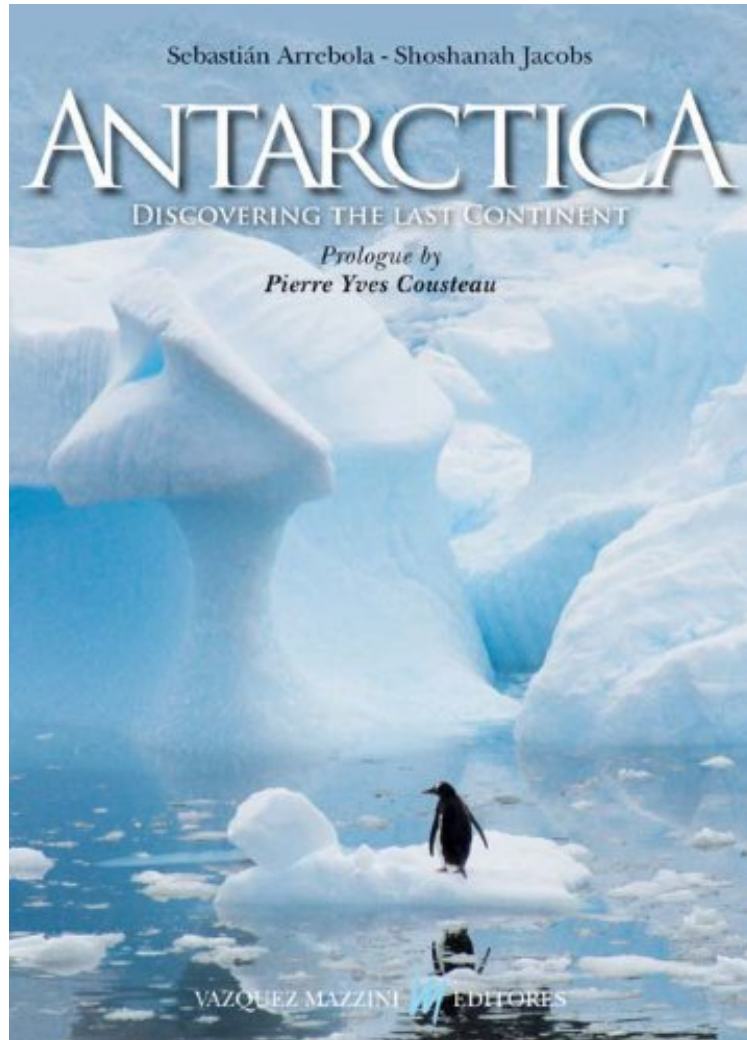

About the Author Shoshanah became a sailor when she was 6 years old and her parents bought a 12 meter motor yacht. They told her that only when she learned to swim would they be able to spend their summers on the lake system of eastern Canada. Until that time, her first dive, though technically in a swimming pool at the age of 4, was by far the

most exciting moment of her life. That experience created a path towards becoming a marine biologist from which she would never divert. Originally from Ottawa, Canada, Shoshanah moved to the east coast of Canada, where she earned a Bachelor's Degree in Marine Biology, studying harbour seal population dynamics and completing an independent study on the shark distribution around San Salvador Island, Bahamas, while spending as much time in the water with them as possible. Her MSc dissertation focussed on the acoustic ecology of seals and the effects of aquaculture on their population distribution. She returned to Ottawa in 2001 to complete her Doctoral dissertation on the energy dynamics of Arctic seabirds. During her university career, she became politically active and has gained valuable experience in public speaking, media interviews, negotiations and fundraising. She is trained in field and laboratory analyses, has supervised and led scientific teams and has been training young scientists and expedition guides. Her fieldwork led her to some of the most isolated areas of Canada, sparking a passion for expeditions and travel. In 2005, she joined an Inuit-owned company taking tourists on ship-based expeditions to Canada's North. Then she caught the southern bug and began sailing to South Georgia Island and the Antarctic Peninsula. With so much cold climate experience, Shoshanah decided to test her skills in warmer waters and has led expeditions in the Caribbean. Believe it or not there are still some wild and wonderful places left to explore! She has worked in pretty much every onboard job from deck hand to Expedition Leader while maintaining an active scientific career and publishing record. Shoshanah has been lecturing in various capacities for many years. As a graduate student, she studied teaching concurrently with her research and taught several classes to undergraduates, as a part time professor she developed a creative and challenging curriculum, and as a visiting lecturer she fascinates her audience with curious facts from the mysterious scientific world and stories from her travels. Shoshanah has just returned to Canada after three years living in Tierra del Fuego where she was working on penguin diet studies. During that time she co-authored this book about Antarctica (Available in Spanish or English) with an introduction by Pierre-Yves Cousteau. Shoshanah is fluent in English, French, and Spanish.
