And I'm not any sort of a denier. It is a beautiful book and the photos are fine quality. Many were apparently taken under very difficult circumstances and digital photography is used here to allow the results. Your first impression is that the place is very, very blue. The rare green water is all the more striking for it. Something you can look at again and again.

that this icy ecosystem serves as a final warning of impending environmental deterioration.
