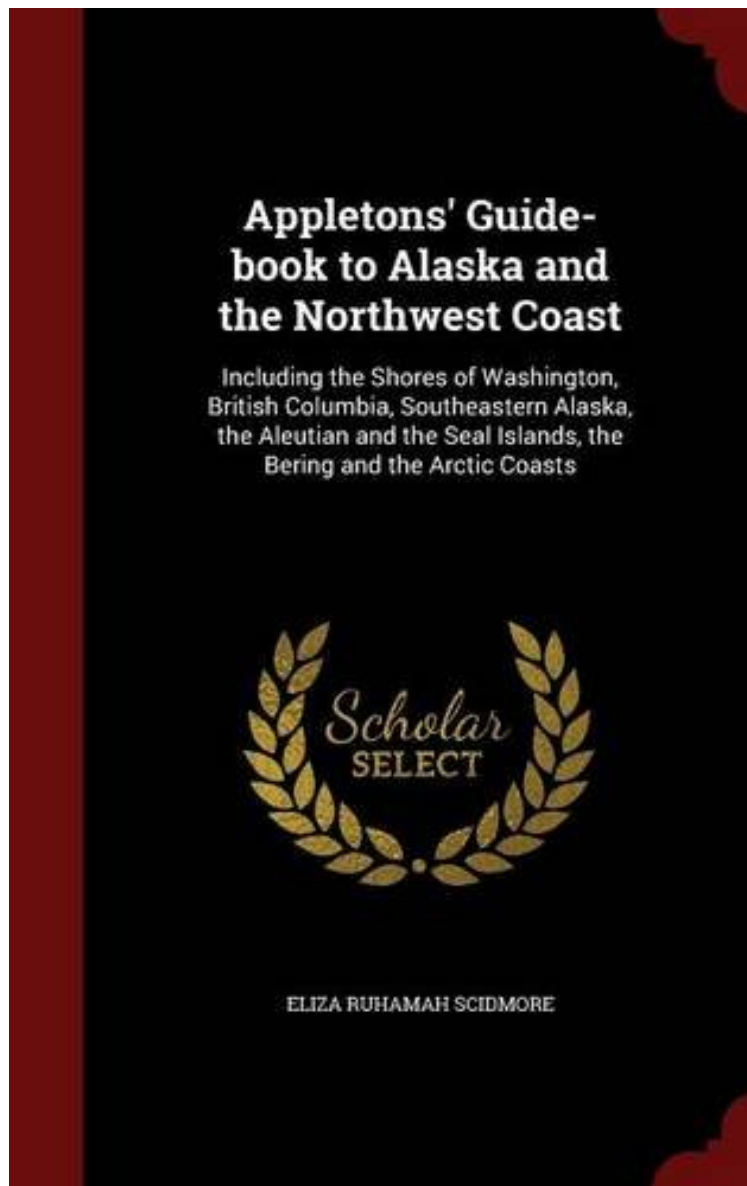


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## **Appletons' Guide-book to Alaska and the Northwest Coast: Including the Shores of Washington, British Columbia, Southeastern Alaska, the Aleutian and the Seal Islands, the Bering and the Arctic Coasts**

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SchwartzmanAppletons' Guide-Book to Alaska (1896) is a fascinating snapshot of the Alaska Territory before the height of the Klondike Gold Rush. The coastline from the Inside Passage to the Aleutian Islands is well-known (Sitka is still the territorial capital), but the Interior remains a mystery: Neither Anchorage nor Fairbanks has been established, and Mt. McKinley has yet to be discovered--Mt. Logan at 19,539 feet is reported to be the highest peak on the North American continent. I have many guidebooks to Alaska, having traveled there 12 times for my work as a travel writer, but Appletons' is the only one I keep on my desk, just for inspiration.

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
