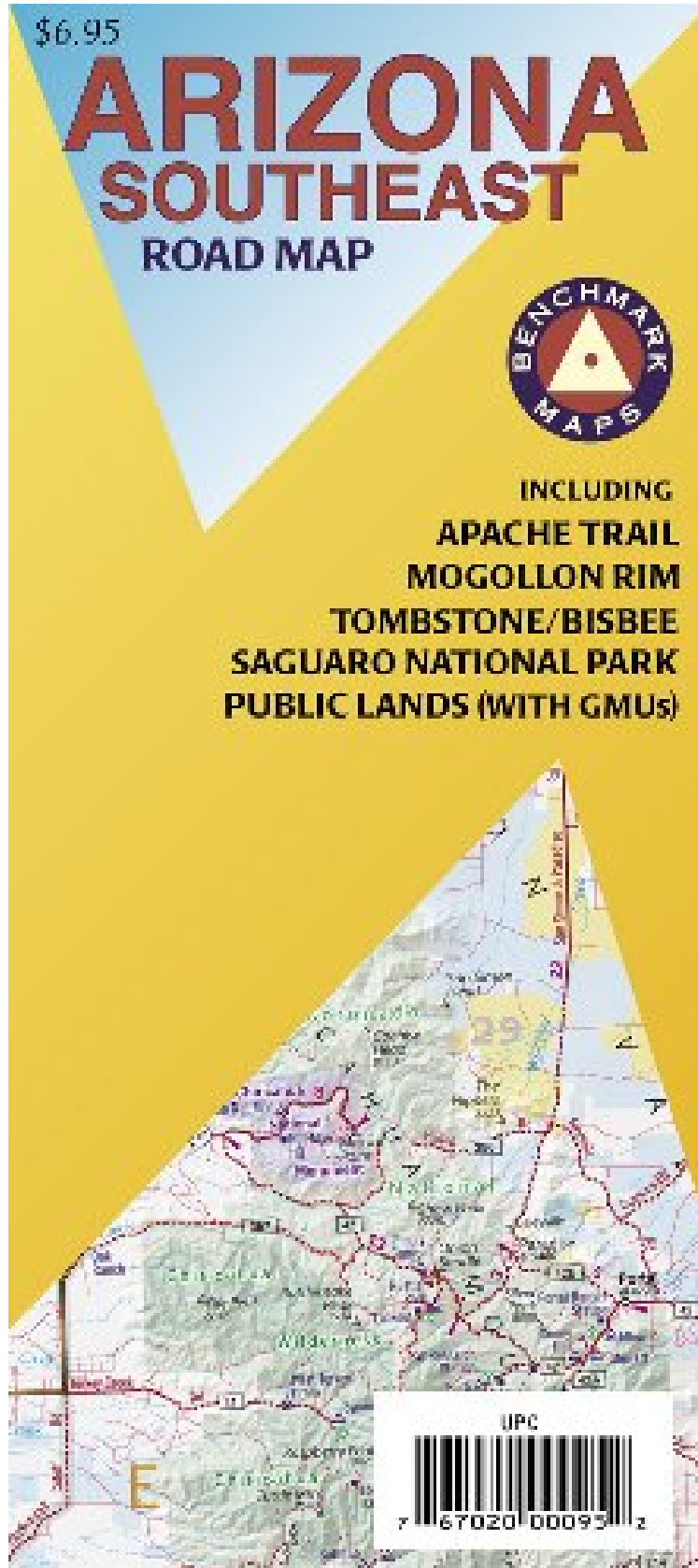

Benchmark hasn't updated the state since 2007 and my old map has gotten too roadworn. But when I got this map today I was immediately disappointed. The map is the same scale as the Benchmark gazetteer (1:400,000) but the print looks like a copy of a copy. Some roads are illegible and some smaller towns' names are blotchy. (See my photo below the product).The maps is more convenient to carry than an entire state gazetteer, and the material is water-resistant, but for the price customers pay, Benchmark should use a much better printing press with a better map. I guess my ratty old 2007 edition of Benchmark's Arizona will get more use out of it than expected.These foldable maps of the state come in a set of four. The other three sections of this foldable Arizona map look much better than this Southeastern section. All four foldables have maps on both sides of the treated paper. The only really bad print is the far southeastern corner of the state, which includes Tucson. I guess Benchmark thinks no one who lives here cares about getting an updated map of the state. BatesThese "Benchmark" maps are very good maps. The old-fashioned folding allows for easy storage. The maps are simply paper and have no moisture resistance - so cannot use them outside the vehicle or dwelling. Sometimes there is so much verbiage on the map that it overpowers the map details. I found that on one map there was a road (I assume 4x4), but it was not included in the map's key. The best maps are made by National Geographic; Trails Illustrated.
