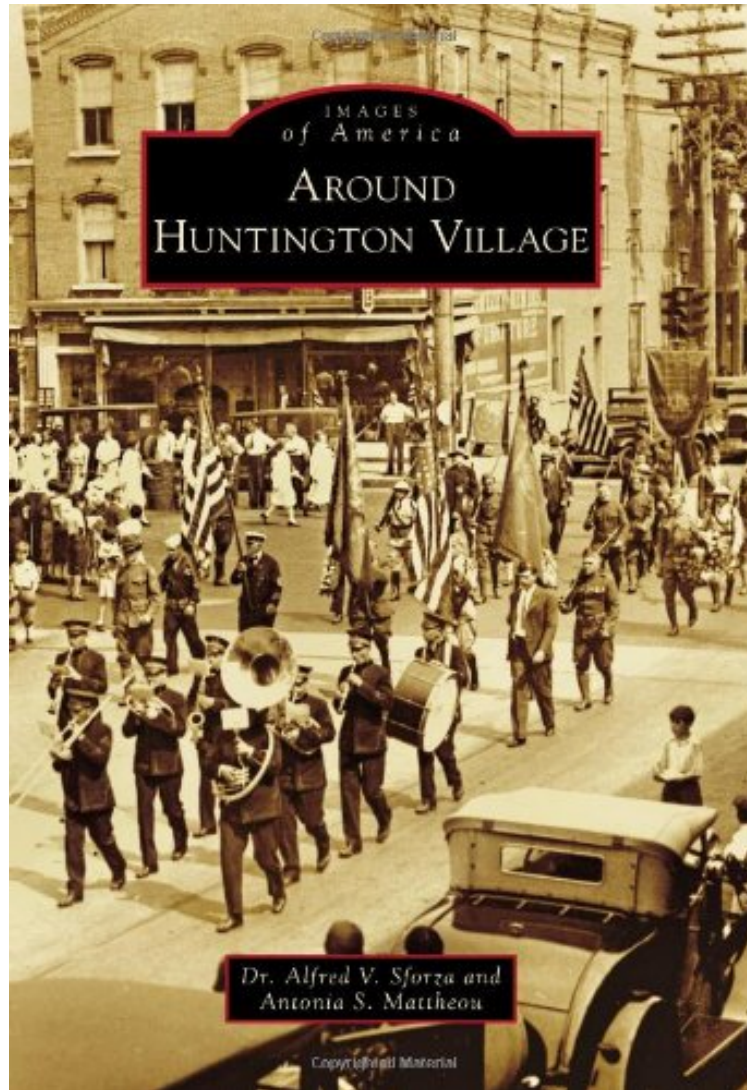

Good Photos but some captions wrong By William Norton-Taylor My primary reason for purchasing this book was for the historic photos of sites within the Village of Northport. While I was pleased with the photos, the author apparently knows little of the history of Northport, nor it's geography. The caption for a photo of the original Northport Library on Main Street states that it is located at Main Street and

Woodbine Ave. - the Library is actually more than a quarter of a mile away from Woodbine Ave, it's located at Main St. and WOODSIDE Ave. The caption for a photo of the trolley that ran on Main St and Laurel Ave from Northport to the LIRR station in East Northport in the early 1900's the author states that "Later" tracks were laid on Main St, as if the Main St. tracks were an extension of the original system. In Fact the tracks on Main St were an essential part of the system from the beginning. The caption for a photo of the Jesse Carll ship yard states that it was located on Woodbine Ave. In fact it was located on Bayview Ave. These errors leave me wondering about the accuracy of the captions for photos which I do not have personal knowledge of. I suggest that the author (and the publisher) consult a map more often and do a more careful job of proofreading. Buy this book for the photos, but be wary of the historical information provided about them.

Founded in 1653, the town of Huntington is situated on what is known as the Gold Coast of Long Island. The incorporated villages within the town are Huntington Bay, Lloyd Harbor, Asharoken, and Northport. Huntington has always attracted a population that has created a foundation of diversity. Settlement-era properties, castles of the Victorian period, and main streets still adorn the town as witnesses of the people who lived here and a community that is still thriving. A few of the castles and mansions that once existed in the town have disappeared, some by wear and tear and others through neglect. Still others have been converted into academic institutions and museums. Around Huntington Village shares photographs that give meaning to the events in the lives of the people who lived here.

About the Author Dr. Alfred V. Sforza is a dentist, local historian, and lifelong resident of the town of Huntington. He is the author of three books on the town history and a three-term member of the Huntington Historical Society Board of Trustees. Antonia S. Mattheou is the Huntington town archivist. She also serves as the committee chair/grants administrator for the Huntington Harbor Lighthouse Preservation Society.
