guy on a bicycle at a time when there were few bikes outside of cities. He doesn't have a 21 speed modern vehicle, he rides a simple bike (actually he walks and carries his bike over the most rugged terrain). His commentary about the people he encounters is full of interesting, if highly biased and socially incorrect by our modern standards, descriptions of everything he sees. Somehow he survives the hardships and actually prospers on the journey.
