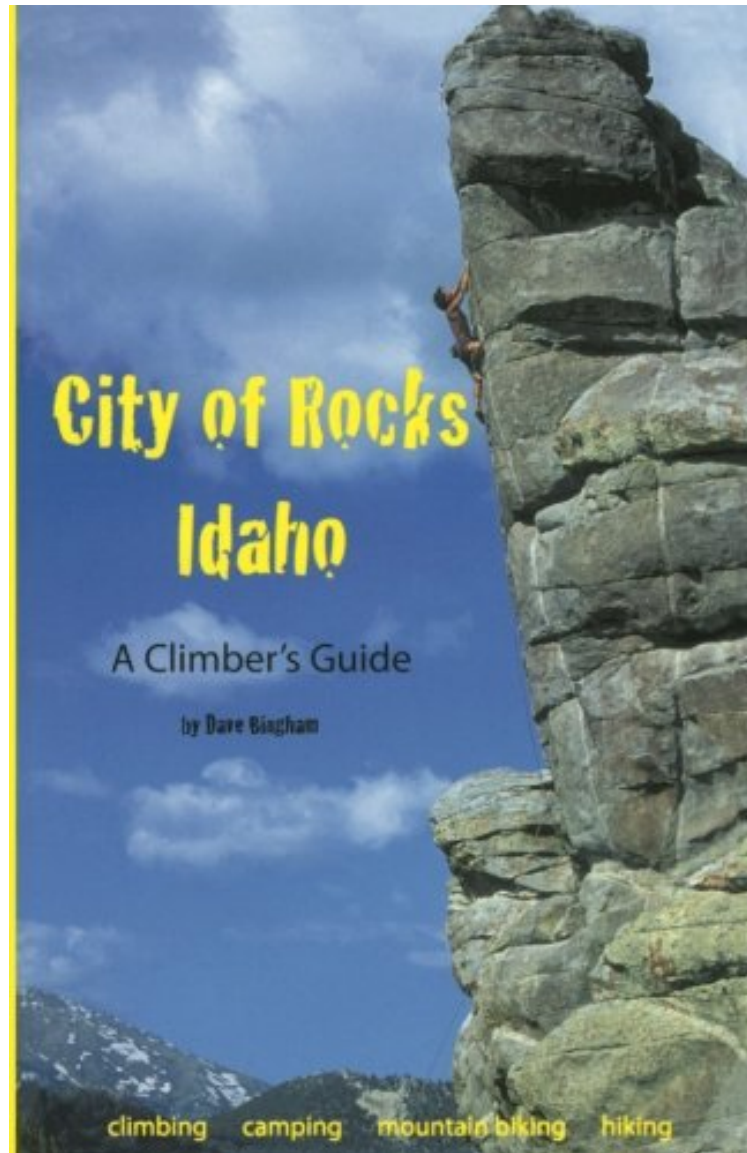

By Jim Morrison This may be the best rock climbing guide book on the area, but it has both some good qualities and some flaws. The pictures and the maps, both large scale and small scale are adequate. However, he leaves out too much in the narrative description of the climbs. Sometimes he doesn't even say if the route is trad or sport. I was certainly happy to have the book on a recent trip to the COR, but sometimes I felt I needed more beta on the climbs before starting out. I was able to find out some details on many routes on line, including a list of the best sport routes. I don't know who provides the ratings, perhaps not Bingham, but we thought they were pretty stiff. Climbs listed as 5.7 seemed more like 5.8 and so on.
