While it checks in at around 300 pages it sure doesn't feel like it. A truly easy read of mostly independent chapters chronicling events from his time abroad in South America. As a fellow American living in Peru I was at least aware of most of what he talked about and somewhat familiar with about half of it. As such I must admit a bit of unique appeal that didn't disappoint. It's not always about the extraordinariness of the person or events in question, rather the relatable ordinariness with which almost anyone could see happening to themselves. An outside observer might not find such stories too inspiring though with a good attitude and a bit of self-reflection Rhein is able to make his journey more than worth your time. In a few dozen bite sized chunks it demonstrates that more often than not there's a silver lining / learning experience / newfound perspective that can be drawn from everyday activities, doubly so if done in a foreign, exotic land. For those with similar adventurous inclinations who think they may be unprepared let Rhein show you that you probably are, but that that's okay. For those interested yet not quite able to follow such a path allow *Reckless Traveler* to give you a vicarious taste that may, if even for a moment, make you question such an inability.
