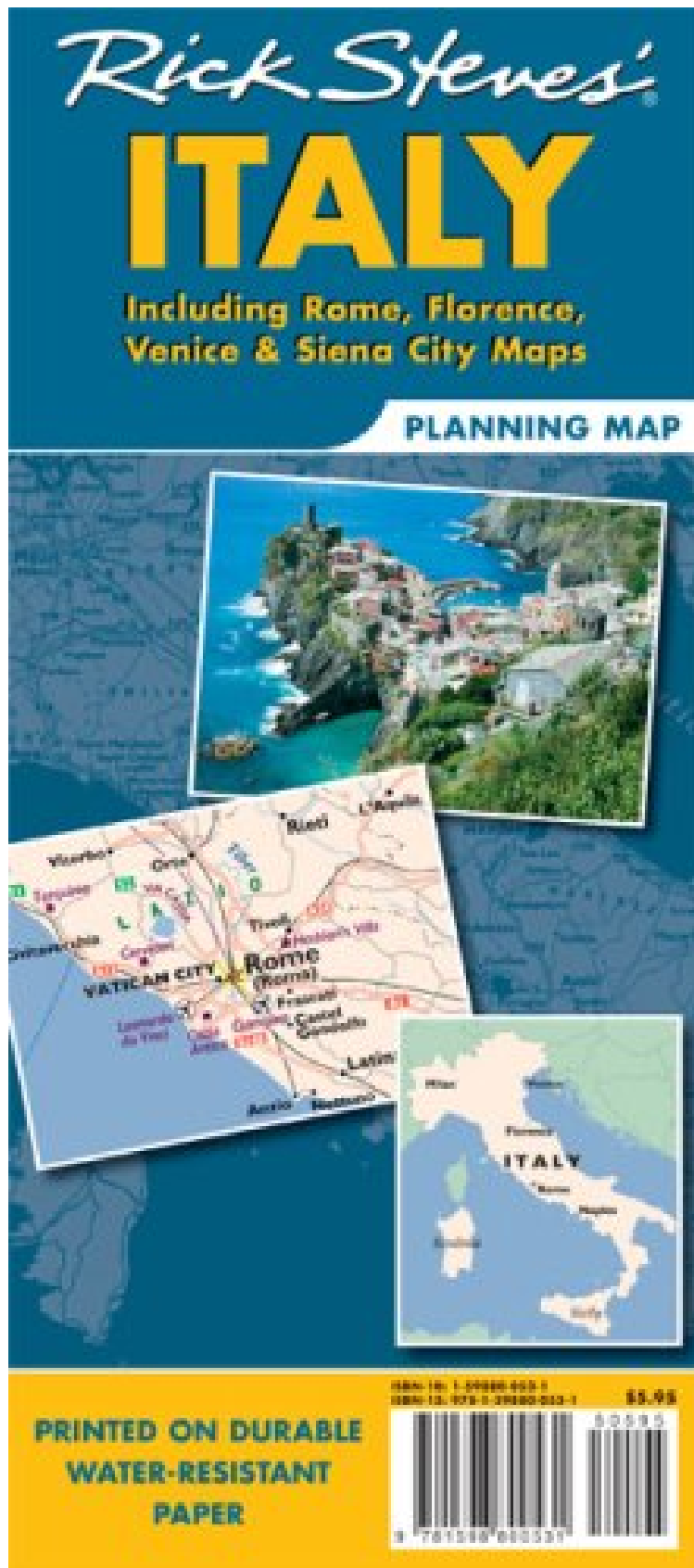

This map was excellent for Venice and Florence, but Rome was another story. The map covers too small an area of central Rome. Even the Vatican is only partially included on the edge of the covered area. The Vatican metro station is off the map so you do not know any street names or directions to get back on to the map. The central metro station (Termini) also slides off the another edge so when you come out of the station you have a good chance of not being on the map.
