Robinson Crusoe Island (Isla Robinson Crusoe) 1:115,000 Southern Chile Visitor's MapThis map of Robinson Crusoe Island is a part of a map of southern Chile. The inset map is relatively small (like the island) at very good hiking scale 1:115,000 (1 inch = 1.8 miles). The island is only 19 km / 11 miles long. Formerly known as Ms a Tierra, it is the largest island of the Chilean Juan Fernndez archipelago, situated 674 kilometres west of Chile. The archipelago is made up of three islands - Robinson Crusoe, Alejandro Selkirk and Santa Clara. Alexander Selkirk, a Scottish sailor, was marooned here in 1704, and lived in solitude for four years and four months. He is the real-life model of the fictional Robinson Crusoe. The main map covers the southern portion of South America, the whole of Patagonia in Chile and Argentina, from Temuco (Chile), and Neuquen and Bahia Blanca (Argentina) south, at scale 1:2,000,000. The map is essential for the mainland preparation to the trip to Robinson Crusoe Island. Tourists number in the hundreds per year. One activity gaining popularity is scuba diving, particularly on the wreck of the German light cruiser SMS Dresden, which was scuttled in Cumberland Bay during the Battle of Ms a Tierra during the First World

War.
