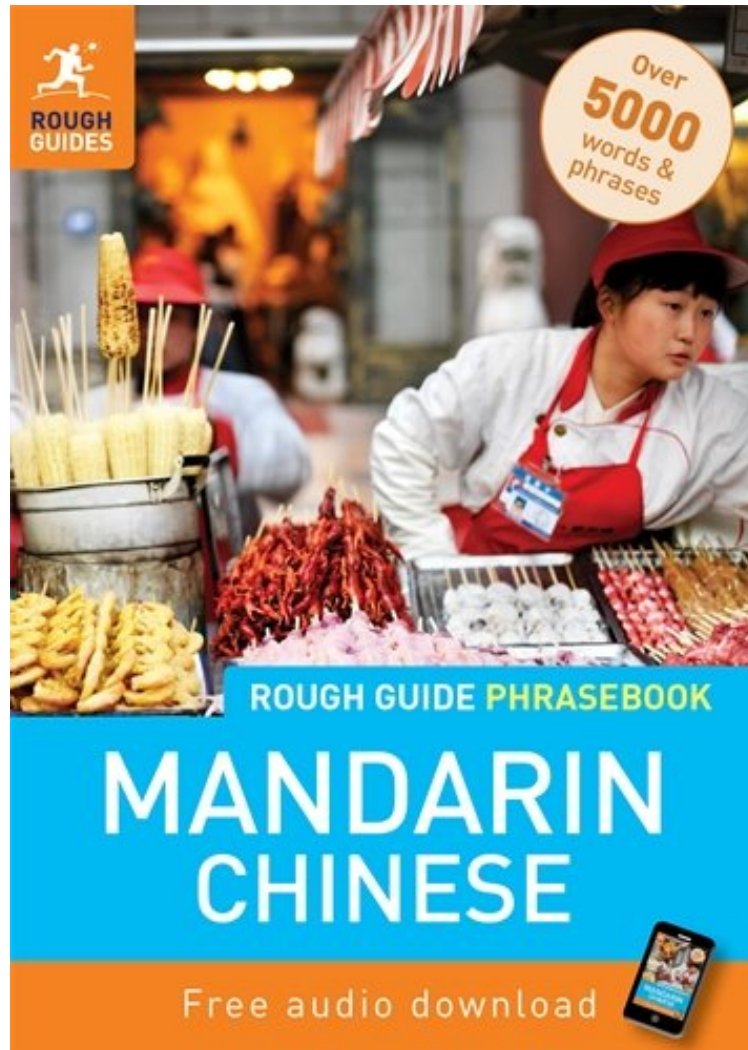

The phrases offered are useful and the dictionary is complete enough to get the casual tourist by without being so complete that you need to spend a lot of time looking up how to say chicken while the waitress is waiting to take your order. The book is reasonably small and packed well in my

fiancee's purse for daytime excursions and I selected this phrasebook partly for that reason as I've heard some of the other leading phrasebooks can be a little unwieldy. I was happy with the book and it helped us communicate. The only thing that made me give it 4 stars instead of 5 was that a lot of the example phrases in the situations sections were very specific and could probably be simplified for people with no experience with Mandarin so they could more easily substitute words in from the dictionary for their own situation. Still, the book was very helpful and I recommend it to anyone looking for a quick communication guide for traveling in Mandarin speaking areas. 4 of 5 people found the following review helpful. This book is worthless. By Benjamin Kant. Contrary to the 5-star reviews, I found this book absolutely worthless. For one thing, most of it is composed of a simple dictionary, which is worthless by itself as it has such a limited amount of words, and a simple Langenscheidt pocket dictionary has so much more. The phrase book part is then limited to about 40 pages, and whether they contain some useful expressions is meaningless because they are all given in pinyin only, without the Chinese characters. Guess what: Chinese is NOT a European language, and unless you are an expert in accurate pinyin pronunciation you will not be understood at all when you say any of the phrases in the book. The best way to use a phrase book is to have all three: your language, pinyin, and the Chinese characters. So that when you say something most likely stupid you can then point to the characters and be understood (oh, that is what you meant - got it!). Get these 2 books (besides the Langenscheidt): China Survival Guide by Herzberg and the Lonely Planet Mandarin Phrasebook. Besides, get yourself a Chinese-speaking person to accompany you everywhere, until you learn the language well enough to convey and receive information (six months for me, if I wanted to). Be prepared for a major culture shock if you think you can survive in China with this phrasebook (or any phrasebook, for that matter). 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
