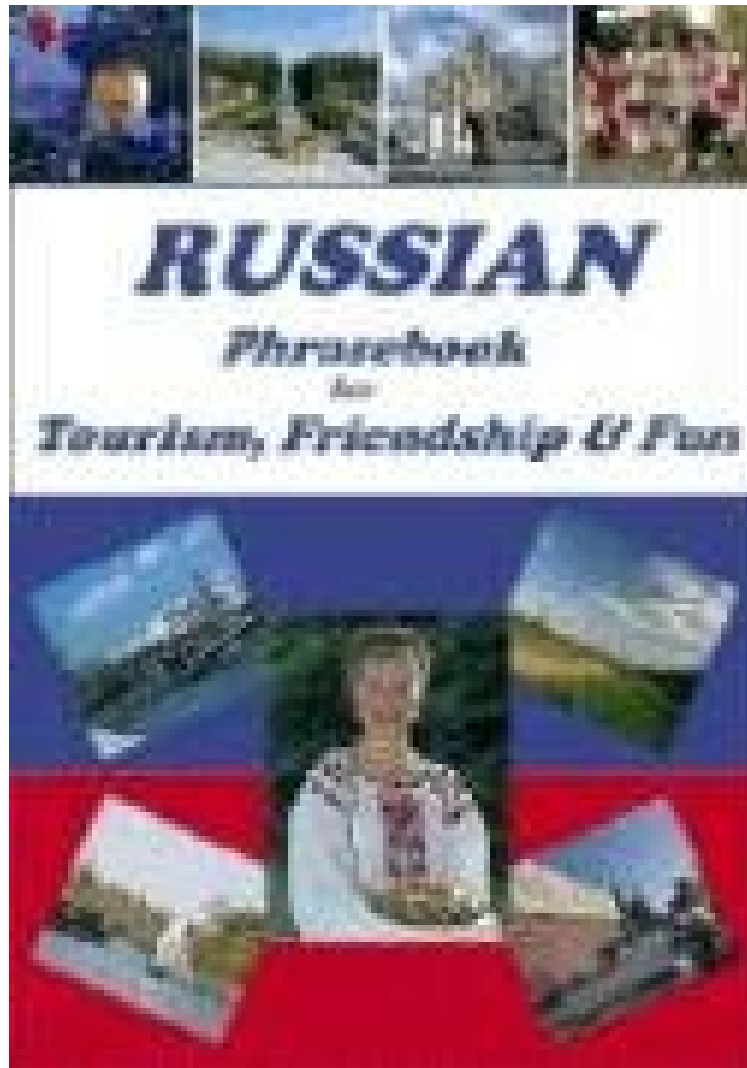

This book was very helpful in getting the expressions I needed right and in a way that helped my Russian friends understand exactly what I was trying to say. While it is not really a fast reference book for simple expressions (there are many such books available) I found it to be very helpful in

communicating more difficult or detailed expressions just not covered in the tourist guides. The variety of options and American English expressions it covers are excellent. The only real downside I could find was the menu reference in the rear of the book. All the Russian menus I came across listed items that just were not to be found in the reference section. Not only does this phrasebook offer more than twice as many phrases as any other, its flexible, common-sense system makes it uncommonly quick and easy to find them. The phrasebook goes far beyond the typical fare for tourism and day-to-day living in Russian-speaking countries by providing a treasure chest of vocabulary and expressions for getting acquainted, socializing, making friends, having fun and even pursuing romance. English entries and Russian Cyrillic in black are followed by the Russian pronunciation in blue. Ten appendices help the user with the Cyrillic alphabet, pronunciation, grammar, numbers, clock/calendar time, and metric measurements, plus glossaries of food and drink.
