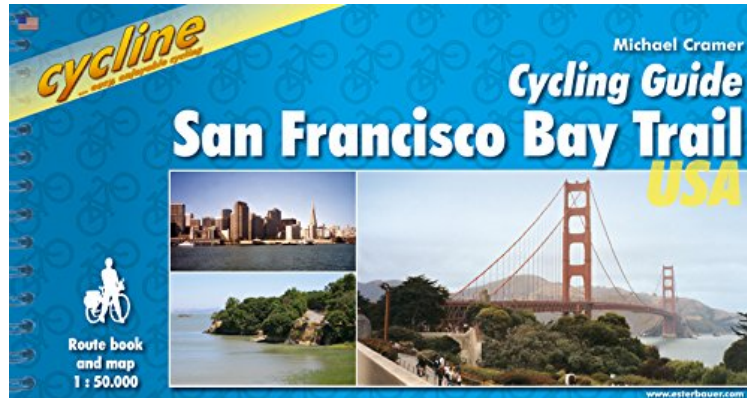

I have already used them in Tuscany, Provence, Alps, Germany, Santhiago de Compostela and in many others cycle tours in Europe.Usually the books are very precise, accurate and have a fantastic quantity of information for the bicycle rider. Maps have excelent scale: 1:50.000 or 1:75.000, which provide very clear and detailed routes. At the end of the books there is a long list of hotels, restaurants and bike shops.Unfortunately, the San Francisco Bay tour is quite far from the quality standard of Esterbauer. I am not so sure if the area isn't so attractive or doesn't have very much to show, but the book is poor regarding touristic information or historic points of interest. It looks like the author decided to write the book in a rush. The big mistake is the wine region, one of the most interesting portion of the tour. There is not any map regarding how to reach or cycle in the Napa Valley.The author says that this portion is not complete yet and just recommends that you take a bus to go there.This is not acceptable. I have bought the book focusing the wine region, therefore it is useless for me.

The 450-mile San Francisco Bay Trail is a pleasant combination of history workshop and bicycle tourism, of cultural enjoyment and charming flora and fauna. It traverses downtown San Francisco as well as the San Francisco National Wildlife Refuge and leads through almost 1000 parks or prtected reserve lands. This colorfully illustrated book enables the cyclist to experience the trail fully by describing points of interest and providing clear maps. The book is divided into 26 sections, each representing a portion of the Trail. Each section begins and ends at a public transportation station, allowing easy navigation from any given point.

About the AuthorA former member of the Berlin city-stte parliament, and current member of the European Parliament, Michael Cramer has been a lecturer on urban and transportation policy. He regularly publishes articles and reports in various print media, including a guide to the 160 km Berlin Wall Trail. For more than 25 years, Michael Cramer has practiced car-free living in Berlin. He gets around that large city by bicycle, bus, train or taxi. He has a detailed knowledge of the conditions bicyclists face in Berlin and has also enjoyed bicycle vacations on cycling routes in the United States, Austria, Switzerland, France and other parts of Germany.
